CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Sections 9-6.14:11 and 54.1-2919 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), an informal conference was held with Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. on March 29, 1990 in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Members of the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") serving on the informal conference committee ("Committee") were: Gerald J. Bechamps, M.D., Chairman; Tony C. Butera, D.P.M.; and Charles H. Crowder, Jr., M.D. Dr. Jones was present at the informal conference, but was not represented by counsel. The Board was represented by Frank W. Pedrotty, Assistant Attorney General. The purpose of the informal conference was to inquire into allegations that Dr. Jones may have violated certain laws governing the practice of medicine in Virginia, as set forth in the Board's notice of informal conference dated February 28, 1991.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Now, having properly considered the evidence presented, the Committee finds by clear and convincing evidence that:

1. Based upon Dr. Jones' own admission, during the period May 1989 through December 11, 1989 he excessively used alcohol and self-administered hydrocodone, a schedule III controlled substance of high abuse potential.

2. Based on Dr. Jones' own admission, between October 1989 and December 10, 1989 he diverted from his medication inventory at his office in Sterling, Virginia, the following controlled substances of high abuse potential: 30 Demerol 100 mg tubex syringes (Schedule II); 40 Demerol 50 mg tubex syringes (Schedule II); 4 Dilaudid 20 cc multiple dose vials (Schedule II); 10 Fentanyl 2 ml

ampules (Schedule II) and 30 Versed 10 mg/2 ml ampules. Said diversion was with the intent to evade the law with respect to the disposition of the aforementioned controlled substances.

3. On December 11, 1989 Dr. Jones was admitted to Springwood Psychiatric Institute in Leesburg, Virginia for treatment of poly-drug abuse. He was discharged on January 18, 1990 with a diagnosis of "opioid dependence, alcohol dependence and benzodiazepine dependence."

4. On July 29, 1990 Dr. Jones was taken by the State Police to the Winchester Medical Center Emergency Room after having been charged with driving while under the influence. The diagnosis was "Acute Drug Ingestion." Based on his own admission, he had self-administered 400 mgs of Demerol and 10 mgs of Versed.

5. Dr. Jones' sobriety date for alcohol use is December 10, 1989. He has been drug free since July 30, 1990.

6. Dr. Jones is currently undergoing psychiatric treatment and has been participating in a structured outpatient chemical dependency program sponsored by the Springwood Psychiatric Institute, Leesburg, Virginia.

7. Dr. Jones continues to be actively involved in his recovery. He attends regular meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous.

8. Since July 30, 1990, all random drug screens have been negative.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Committee concludes that Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. has violated Section 54.1-2915.A(3) as further defined in Section 54.1-2914.A(3), (9) and (10) of the Code.

CONSENT

I, Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., by affixing my signature hereto, acknowledge that:

1. I have been specifically advised to seek the advice of counsel prior to signing this document;

2. I am aware that without my consent, no legal action can be taken against me, except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, Section 9-6.14:1 et seq., of the Code;

3. I have the following rights, among others: the right to a formal fact finding hearing before the Board, to reasonable notice of said hearing, to representation by counsel, and to cross-examine witnesses against me;

4. I waive all such rights to a formal hearing;

5. I admit to the foregoing Findings of Fact; and

6. I consent to the entry of this Consent Order affecting my license to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia be placed on INDEFINITE PROBATION upon the following terms and conditions:

1. By June 30, 1991, Dr. Jones shall enter into an aftercare contract with the Medical Society of Virginia's Physicians' Health and Effectiveness Program.

2. Dr. Jones shall abstain completely from the use of alcohol and narcotics.

3. Dr. Jones shall remain under the care of his current treating psychiatrist with quarterly reports regarding Dr. Jones' treatment and progress submitted to the Board.

4. Dr. Jones shall continue to attend regular meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous.

5. Dr. Jones shall be evaluated by the Board's psychiatric consultant(s) within one(1) year of the entry of this Consent Order, with a report of said evaluation submitted to the Board.

6. Dr. Jones shall sign an Authorization for Disclosure of Information form providing for unrestricted communication between the Board, Dr. Jones' treating psychiatrist and the Board's psychiatric consultants.

7. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from performing in his office any and all medical procedures which require the use of intravenous sedation or intravenous analgesia.

8. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from maintaining in his office any and all Schedule II and III narcotic controlled substances.

9. Dr. Jones shall provide a copy of this Consent Order to the President, Chief Executive Officer and Director of Medical Affairs at the Loudoun Hospital Center. Dr. Jones shall insure that all appropriate medical and nursing staff are informed of his chemical dependency, in order that no controlled substances are left unattended in his presence.

10. Dr. Jones shall appear before an informal conference committee after the Board has received the report of its psychiatric consultants. Such committee shall provide the ongoing monitoring of Dr. Jones' indefinite probation, determine the frequency of further appearances by Dr. Jones before it, and shall serve as an instrument of the Board responsible for approving and reviewing all information relative to the terms and conditions of this Consent Order.

11. Dr. Jones shall maintain a course of conduct in his practice of medicine commensurate with the requirements of Chapter 29, Title 54.1 of the Code.

Violation of this Consent Order shall constitute grounds for the revocation of the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. In the event Dr. Jones violates any of the terms and conditions of this Consent Order, a formal administrative hearing shall be convened to determine whether the license of Dr. Jones, shall be revoked.

Pursuant to Section 9-6.14:14 of the Code, the signed original of this Consent Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a

public record and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.

CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Sections 9-6.14:11 and 54.1-2919 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), an informal conference was held with Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. on May 8, 1992 in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Members of the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") serving on the informal conference committee ("Committee") were: Charles N. Van Horn, M.D., Chairman; Tony C. Butera, D.P.M.; and Walton M. Belle, M.D. Dr. Jones was present, but was not represented by counsel. The Board was represented by Clyde W. Mathews, Jr., Assistant Attorney General. The purpose of the informal conference was to review Dr. Jones compliance with the terms and conditions of the indefinite probation imposed upon his license pursuant to a Consent Order of the Board dated May 8, 1991 and to inquire into allegations that he may have violated Term 1 of the Board's Consent Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Now, having properly considered the evidence presented, the Committee finds by clear and convincing evidence that Dr. Jones is in compliance with the terms and conditions of the Board's Consent Order dated May 8, 1991. In addition, the Committee found no evidence to support allegation No. 1 of the Board's April 6, 1992 notice of informal conference.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Committee concludes that Dr. Jones is properly before it and it is responsible for approving and reviewing all information relative to his compliance with the terms and conditions of his

indefinite probation, and has the discretion to modify and/or continue the terms of the May 8, 1991 Consent Order.

CONSENT

I, Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. by affixing my signature hereto, acknowledge that:

1. I have been specifically advised to seek the advice of counsel prior to signing this document;

2. I am aware that without my consent, no legal action can be taken against me, except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, Section 9-6.14:1 et seq., of the Code;

3. I have the following rights, among others: the right to a formal fact finding hearing before the Board, to reasonable notice of said hearing, to representation by counsel, and to cross-examine witnesses against me;

4. I waive all such rights to a formal hearing;

5. I admit to the foregoing Findings of Fact; and

6. I consent to the entry of this Consent Order affecting my license to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. to practice medicine in Virginia be CONTINUED on INDEFINITE PROBATION upon the following terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Jones shall comply with his Aftercare contract with the Medical Society of Virginia's Physicians' Health and Effectiveness Program.

2. Dr. Jones shall abstain completely from the use of alcohol and narcotics.

3. Dr. Jones shall remain under the care of his current treating psychiatrist with quarterly reports regarding Dr. Jones' treatment and progress submitted to the Board.

4. Dr. Jones shall continue to attend regular meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous.

5. Dr. Jones shall be evaluated by the Board's psychiatric consultant(s) within one (1) year of the entry of this Consent Order, with a report of said evaluation submitted to the Board.

6. Dr. Jones shall update his Authorization of Disclosure of Information Form providing for unrestricted communication between the Board, Dr. Jones' treating psychiatrist and the Board's psychiatric consultants.

7. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from performing in his office any and all medical procedures which require the use of intravenous sedation or intravenous analgesia.

8. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from maintaining in his office any and all Schedule II and III narcotic controlled substances.

9. Dr. Jones shall provide a copy of this Consent Order to the President, Chief Executive Officer and Director of Medical Affairs at the Loudoun Hospital Center. Dr. Jones shall insure that all appropriate medical and nursing staff are informed of his chemical dependency, in order that no controlled substances are left unattended in his presence.

10. Dr. Jones shall appear before an informal conference committee after the Board has received the report of its psychiatric consultants. Such committee shall provide the ongoing monitoring of Dr. Jones' indefinite probation, determine the frequency of further appearances by Dr. Jones before it, and shall serve as an instrument of the Board responsible for approving and reviewing all information relative to the terms and conditions of this Consent Order.

11. Dr. Jones shall maintain a course of conduct in his practice of medicine commensurate with the requirements of Chapter 29, Title 54.1 of the Code.

Violation of this Consent Order shall constitute grounds for the revocation of the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. In the event Dr. Jones violates any of the terms and conditions of this Consent Order, a formal administrative hearing

shall be convened to determine whether the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. shall be revoked.

Pursuant to Section 54.1-2919 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, any request for a hearing before the Board must be filed within 30 days upon receipt of this Order.

Pursuant to Section 9-6.14:14 of the Code, the signed original of this Consent Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.

CONSENT ORDER

On March 11, 2003, Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. ("Dr. Jones") petitioned the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") for reinstatement of his license to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Board and Dr. Jones, as evidenced by their signatures affixed below, agree to enter into this Consent Order affecting the license of Dr. Jones to practice medicine in Virginia.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board adopts the following findings in this matter:

1. Dr. Jones was issued license number 0101-044170 by the Board to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia on August 1, 1989. Said license was mandatorily suspended on August 9, 2001, based on Dr. Jones' conviction of a felony, as outlined in Finding 2, below.
2. On August 2, 2001, in the United States District Court, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria Division, Dr. Jones was convicted of one (1) count of possession of meperidine hydrochloride (Demerol, a Schedule II controlled substance), by fraud and deceit. Dr. Jones was sentenced to thirty (30) months in prison, followed by supervised release for three (3) years.
3. The Board previously met with Dr. Shaw at an informal conference on October 15, 1999, at which time it addressed his diversion and personal use of meperidine hydrochloride that ultimately resulted in his felony conviction.
4. Dr. Jones reported a sobriety date of November 15, 1998.

5. Upon release from federal custody, Dr. Jones resumed a contractual relationship with the Virginia Health Practitioners' Intervention Program ("HPIP") on April 10, 2003. Dr. Jones agreed to refrain from the practice of medicine until approved to work in the health professions by HPIP staff.

6. Dr. Jones' treating practitioners support his return to the practice of medicine under HPIP's supervision and appropriate monitoring.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board concludes that Finding 2 constitutes a violation Sections 54.1-2915.A(1) and (3), as further defined in Section 54.1-2914.A(5) and Section 54.1-2916.A(1) of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code").

CONSENT

I, Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., by affixing my signature hereto, acknowledge that:

1. I have been advised specifically to seek the advice of counsel prior to signing this document and am represented by Michael L. Goodman, Esquire;

2. I am fully aware that without my consent, no legal action can be taken against me, except pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, § 2.2-4000.A et seq. of the Code of Virginia;

3. I have the following rights, among others:

- a. the right to a formal hearing before the Board;
- b. the right to representation by counsel; and
- c. the right to cross-examine witnesses against me.

4. I waive all rights to a formal hearing;
5. I admit the truth of the above Findings of Fact; and
6. I consent to the following Order affecting my license to practice medicine in the

Commonwealth of Virginia.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and with the consent of the licensee, it is hereby ORDERED that the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., is REINSTATED upon the following terms and conditions:


1. Dr. Jones shall remain in compliance with his HPIP contract until his successful completion of the HPIP program.
2. Dr. Jones shall maintain a course of conduct in his practice of medicine commensurate with the requirements of Title 54.1, Chapter 29 of the Code and all laws of the Commonwealth.

Violation of this Consent Order shall constitute grounds for the revocation of the license of Dr. Jones. In the event Dr. Jones violates any of the terms and conditions of this Consent Order, an administrative proceeding shall be convened to determine whether his license shall be revoked.

Pursuant to Section 2.2-4023 of the Code, the signed original of this Consent Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.





4. Dr. Jones shall continue to attend regular meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous.

5. Dr. Jones shall be evaluated by the Board's psychiatric consultant(s) within one (1) year of the entry of this Consent Order, with a report of said evaluation submitted to the Board.

6. Dr. Jones shall update his Authorization For Disclosure of Information form providing for unrestricted communication between the Board, Dr. Jones' treating psychiatrist and therapist, and the Board's psychiatric consultant(s).

7. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from performing in his office any and all medical procedures which require the use of intravenous sedation or intravenous analgesia.

8. Dr. Jones shall be prohibited from maintaining in his office any and all Schedule II and III narcotic controlled substances.

9. Dr. Jones shall provide a copy of this Consent Order to the President, Chief Executive Officer and Director of Medical Affairs at the Loudoun Hospital Center. Dr. Jones shall insure that all appropriate medical and nursing staff are informed of his chemical dependency, in order that no controlled substances are left unattended in his presence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Committee concludes that Dr. Jones is properly before it, that it is responsible for approving and reviewing all information relative to Dr. Jones' compliance with the terms and conditions of the Board's September 20, 1993, Consent Order, and that it serves as an instrument of the Board for modifying or terminating the terms and conditions imposed upon Dr. Jones' license.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the INDEFINITE PROBATION imposed upon the license of Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D. to practice medicine and surgery in the Commonwealth of Virginia be TERMINATED. It is further ORDERED that Dr. Jones' license is hereby REINSTATED with all attendant rights and privileges.




ORDER



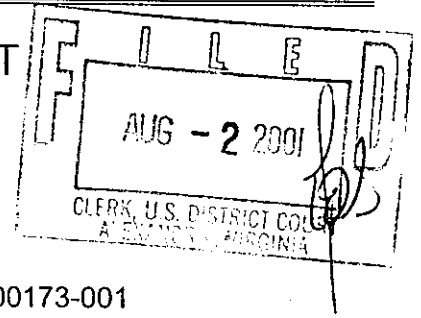

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of THREE (3) YEARS.

The Probation Office shall provide the defendant with a copy of the standard conditions and any special conditions of supervised release.

The defendant shall report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

While on supervised release, the defendant shall not commit another federal, state, or local crime.

While on supervised release, the defendant shall not illegally possess a controlled substance.

While on supervised release, the defendant shall not possess a firearm or destructive device.

If this judgment imposes a fine or a restitution obligation, it shall be a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay any such fine or restitution in accordance with the Schedule of Payments set forth in the Criminal Monetary Penalties sheet of this judgment.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISED RELEASE

- 2) The defendant shall report to the probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month.
- 3) The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer.
- 4) The defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities.
- 5) The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons.

- 11) The defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer.
- 12) The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the Court.
- 13) As directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

While on supervised release, pursuant to this Judgment, the defendant shall also comply with the following additional conditions:

The defendant must satisfactorily participate in, and complete, any inpatient or outpatient substance abuse treatment to which defendant is directed by the probation officer.

CORRECTED ORDER

In accordance with Sections 54.1-2919 and 9-6.14:11 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), an informal conference was held with Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., on October 15, 1999, in Richmond, Virginia. Members of the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") serving on the Informal Conference Committee ("Committee") were: Joseph A. Leming, M.D., Chairman; Clarke Russ, M.D.; and Cedric B. Rucker. Dr. Jones appeared personally and was represented by legal counsel, Michael Goodman, Esquire. The purpose of the informal conference was to inquire into allegations that Dr. Jones may have violated certain laws governing the practice of medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia, as set forth in a Notice of Informal Conference dated September 15, 1999.

An Order was entered on October 25, 1999, in which the Committee made certain Findings of Fact, issued Dr. Jones a reprimand, imposed a monetary penalty upon him, and further ordered that the matter shall be closed upon certain terms and conditions. Pursuant to a request by letter dated November 5, 1999, from Dr. Jones through his counsel, the Committee hereby corrects a discrepancy in the Findings of Fact of the Order entered October 25, 1999. Therefore, the Order entered October 25, 1999 is vacated by the entry of this Corrected Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Now, having properly considered the evidence and statements presented, the Committee makes the following Findings of Fact:

1. By his own admission, in approximately August 1998, Dr. Jones relapsed in his addiction to Demerol (meperidine), a Schedule II controlled substance. As of approximately November 1998, Dr. Jones was using between 300 to 600 mg of Demerol intravenously per day. Additionally, he used Versed (midazolam), a Schedule IV controlled substance, when he was unable to obtain Demerol.

2. On or about November 18, 1998, Dr. Jones was admitted for treatment at Ridgeview Institute, Smyrna, Georgia, with Axis I diagnoses of opioid dependence, continuous; benzodiazepine abuse versus dependence; and alcohol dependence, episodic. Dr. Jones remained at Ridgeview Institute until his discharge on or about February 11, 1999.
3. Dr. Jones obtained Demerol by tampering with and adulterating doses he ordered for patients undergoing endoscopies and colonoscopies at Loudoun Hospital Center, Leesburg, Virginia.
4. Dr. Jones deprived patients of the amount of medication necessary to relieve their pain during the procedures he performed on them. One method by which Dr. Jones obtained Demerol was to inject Demerol into a 10cc vial containing 9 ccs of saline. He would then withdraw 1 cc of the mixture back into the Demerol tubex to administer to the patient and he would retain the remainder for his personal use. The tubex he prepared for patient use contained approximately 10 mg of Demerol, but the 10 cc vial he kept for his own use contained approximately 90 mg of Demerol. However, it had previously been his practice to give a patient approximately 25 mg of Demerol at the start of a procedure and another 25 mg during the procedure. Nursing staff reported that they heard a number of his patients screaming during procedures.
5. Dr. Jones also obtained Demerol and fentanyl, a Schedule II controlled substance, by stealing used syringes that contained these drugs from Sharps boxes at Loudoun Hospital Center. He further obtained Demerol by diverting tubexes containing Demerol left over from procedures and replacing them with tubexes containing saline.
6. By his own admission, Dr. Jones injected himself with drugs between procedures. Endoscopy Suite Staff at Loudoun Hospital Center observed that his eyes were glassy on one occasion, and, on another occasion, his speech was slurred.

7. In order to increase his access to drugs, Dr. Jones added patients to the schedule at the end of the day, he performed repeat procedures, and he had patients re-prepped on the same day instead of sending them home for overnight preparation.
8. Nursing staff noticed that Dr. Jones increased the amount of Versed he used during procedures.
9. By his own admission, in or about August 1998, Dr. Jones used a fentanyl patch from his cat for his personal use.
10. Dr. Jones signed a Participation Contract dated November 17, 1998 with the Health Practitioners' Intervention Program ("HPIP") and a Recovery Monitoring Contract dated April 27, 1999. The Informal Conference Committee identified multiple areas of concern regarding the provisions of the Recovery Monitoring Contract.
11. Sherman Master, M.D., Medical Director for Virginia Monitoring, Inc. and the HPIP, stated that he believes that Dr. Jones is making satisfactory progress at this phase of his recovery. Further, Dr. Master stated that Dr. Jones is safe to practice medicine at this time with appropriate and adequate safeguards on Dr. Jones' access to controlled substances.
12. By letter dated October 4, 1999, Walter M. O'Brien, M.D., President of the Medical Staff of Loudoun Hospital, stated that he is "familiar with the current events involving [Dr. Jones'] drug use, his recovery" and he "fully support[s] his return to practice."
13. By letter dated October 7, 1999, Desi Farren, CAC, Director, The Recovery Center of Northern Virginia, stated that "today, Dr. Jones understands the power of the disease of addiction" and she saw his relapse as "unfortunate, but therapeutic."
14. Virginia Chiantella, M.D., a practicing general surgeon and Dr. Jones' wife, is extremely knowledgeable and realistic about Dr. Jones' recovery process and is a great asset to Dr. Jones' ongoing recovery.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact Nos. 1 through 10, the Committee concludes that Dr. Jones has violated Sections 54.1-2915.A(2), (4) and (3), as further defined in Sections 54.1-2914.A(3), (9), (10), (11), (13) and (14), and Section 54.1-3408.A of the Code.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, based upon Findings of Fact Nos. 1 through 10, it is hereby ORDERED that Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D., be, and hereby is, issued a REPRIMAND, and it is further ORDERED that a MONETARY PENALTY of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) is imposed upon Dr. Jones. Further, upon receipt of evidence of satisfaction of the following terms and conditions, this matter shall be closed:

1. The \$10,000.00 monetary penalty shall be paid within sixty (60) days of entry of this Order.
2. Dr. Jones shall begin following the Center for Disease Control's post-exposure surveillance protocol.
3. Dr. Jones shall remain in HPIP and his Recovery Monitoring Contract shall be amended and, as amended, shall be approved by the Chairman of the Informal Conference Committee. At a minimum, the amended contract shall include that:
 - a. HPIP shall notify the Board should it determine that Dr. Jones has used alcohol or any controlled substances without a proper prescription, and
 - b. Dr. Jones shall immediately notify the Board upon his receipt of notification from HPIP that he is out of compliance with his contract with the HPIP or has been dismissed from HPIP.
4. Dr. Jones shall provide a copy of this Order to the Chief Operating Officer of any hospital, outpatient surgical facility or other institution where he practices.
5. Dr. Jones shall provide a copy of this Order to his treating professionals.

Upon receipt of evidence that Dr. Jones has complied with the requirements of this Order, this case shall be closed without further proceedings. In the event Dr. Jones fails to comply with the requirements of this Order, in the Board's discretion, he may be noticed to meet with an informal conference committee.

Joseph Shaw Jones, M.D.

Dr. Jones shall maintain a course of conduct in his practice of medicine commensurate with the requirements of Title 54.1, Chapter 29 of the Code and all laws of the Commonwealth.


Violation of this Order may constitute grounds for suspension or revocation of Dr. Jones license. In the event that Dr. Jones violates this Order, an administrative proceeding may be convened to determine whether his license shall be revoked.

Pursuant to Section 9-6.14:14 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the Department of Health Professions as a public record, and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon request.

Pursuant to Section 54.1-2919 of the Code, Dr. Jones may, not later than 5:00 p.m., on January 10, 2000, notify Warren W. Koontz, M.D., Executive Director, Board of Medicine, 6606 West Broad Street, Richmond, Virginia 23230, in writing that he desires a formal administrative hearing before the Board. Upon the filing with the Executive Director of a request for the hearing, this Order shall be vacated.

Therefore, this Order shall become final on January 10, 2000, unless a request for a formal administrative hearing is received as described above.
