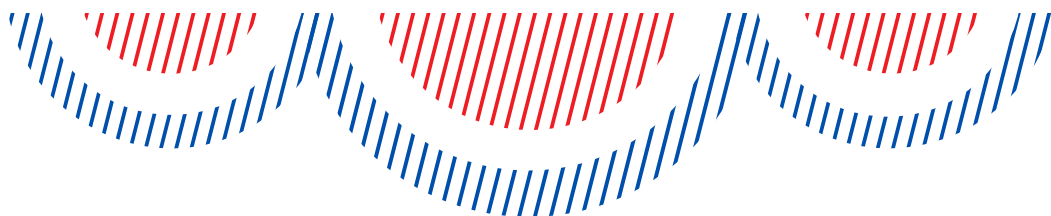

ON THE METRO

- Hours: 4 a.m. to 2 a.m.
Rush-hour service 4 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- Stop closures: Smithsonian, Archives and Mount Vernon Square.
- Yellow Line: Trains going north will end at Gallery Place-Chinatown.
- Weekday peak fares until 9 p.m.
- Metro garages: Normal parking fees.
- Metrobus: Weekday rush-hour service in the morning; early rush-hour service in the afternoon.
- MetroAccess will have the same hours.

- Reserved trains on special schedules.
- Round-trip tickets \$25.
- No regular MARC tickets will be accepted.
- Operating inbound to Washington's Union Station from 7:30 p.m. to 11 a.m. and 1:30 to 7 p.m., Penn and Brunswick lines.
- Penn Line service will not operate north of Baltimore's Penn Station.
- Passengers can board MARC Trains at selected stops.

BY BICYCLE

- No bikes, large coolers or containers allowed on Metrorail.
- Capital Bikeshare corrals will be set up from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m Monday at 17th and K streets NW (Farragut Square), and 12th Street and Independence Avenue SW (USDA building).
- A bike parking lot will be set up on 16th Street NW between I and K streets Monday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Bring your own lock.

- **The American History Museum** will host a broadcast of the swearing in at 11:30 a.m. in Flag Hall. Afterward, visit the “First Ladies” exhibition on the third floor; there, you’ll find two dozen gowns from women including



Jacqueline Kennedy and Laura Bush, as well as one fairly recent addition: Michelle Obama's edgy Jason Wu inaugural gown from 2009.

- **The National Portrait Gallery** (Eight and F streets NW) will display Shepard Fairey's iconic collaged portrait of President Obama and Chuck Close's sprawling 2012 tapestries of the president's visage on its second floor.



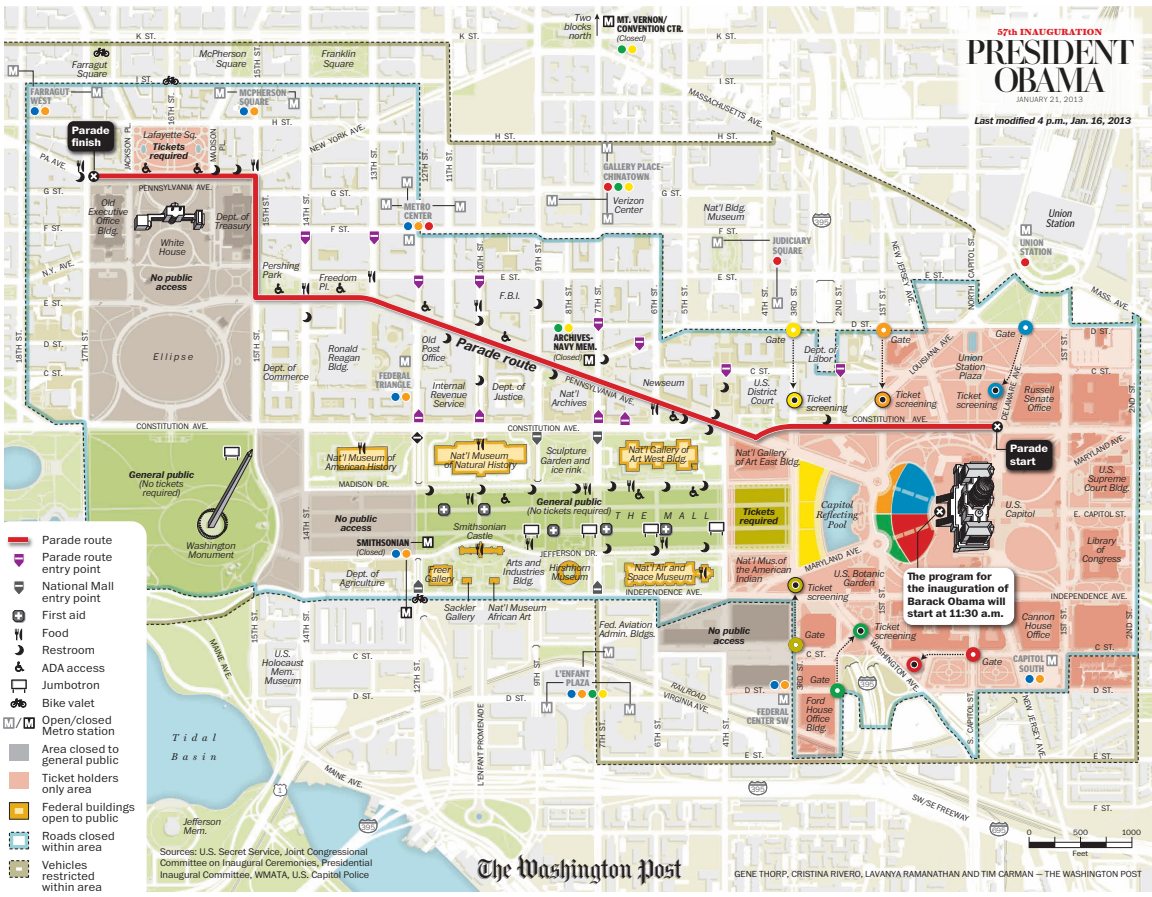

- The inauguration committee wanted to make sure food trucks were permitted within the security perimeter so people could have easy access to meals during the parade along Pennsylvania Ave. The city has not designated specific locations yet, but the food trucks permitted for the parade route include the Fojol Bros.'s Benethiopia, Borinquen Lunch Box, Capital Chicken & Waffles, Caribbean Cafe, Carnivore BBQ, Cirque Cuisine, Crepe Amour, Crepes Parfait, Curbside Cupcakes, El Farolito, Franky Tyler BBQ, Goodies Frozen Custard, Pepe, Make My Cake, Fojol Bros.'s Merlindia, Sidewalk Sweetsations, Surfside, Sweetbites Mobile Cafe and the Big Cheese.
