

NOTABLE PLAYERS

[1] Tiger Woods

Age: 31. **Turned Pro:** 1996

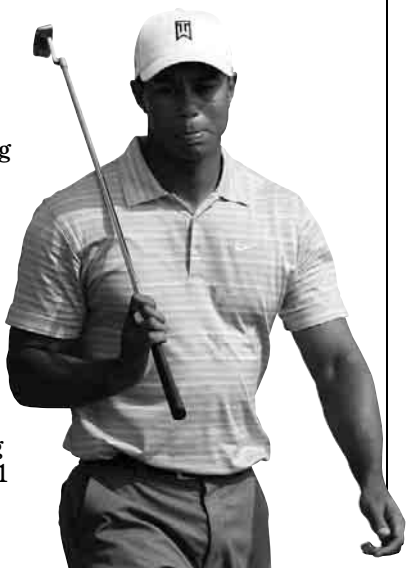
PGA Tour Victories: 57

2007 Earnings: \$4,885,427

Highest World Ranking: 1 (2007)

Notable: Has won 12 majors, including two of the last four. Member of five Ryder Cup teams and four Presidents Cup teams. Only player to win three consecutive U.S. Amateur titles.

Personal: Recently became a father; daughter Sam Alexis was born June 18. His wife's father, Thomas Nordegren, is the Washington bureau chief for Swedish Radio. In 11 years on the tour, Woods has earned nearly \$650 million (including endorsements) and could reach the \$1 billion mark by 2010.



[2] Phil Mickelson

Age: 37. **Turned Pro:** 1992

PGA Tour Victories: 31

2007 Earnings: \$4,120,588

Highest World Ranking: 2 (2006)

Notable: Member of six Ryder Cup and six Presidents Cup teams. Two-time Masters winner (2004, 2006). Won 2005 PGA championship. Last amateur to win a PGA Tour event (1991 Northern Telecom Open). Only left-handed player to win U.S. Amateur. One of three to win the NCAA and U.S. Amateur in the same year.

Personal: Started hitting golf balls at 18 months. Has been unable to fully straighten his right arm since breaking a bone playing middle-school football.



[3] Jim Furyk

Age: 37. **Turned Pro:** 1992

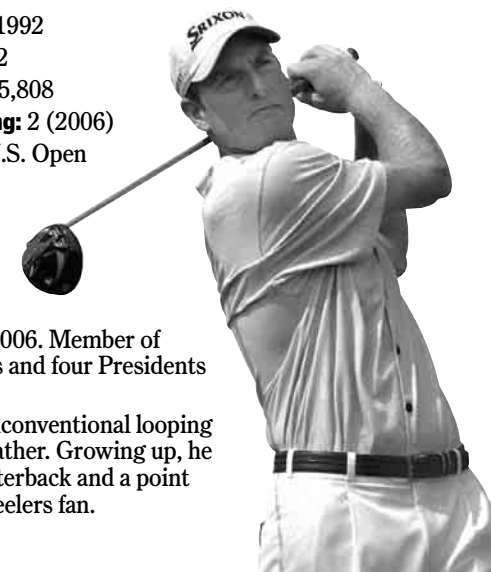
PGA Tour Victories: 12

2007 Earnings: \$2,465,808

Highest World Ranking: 2 (2006)

Notable: Won 2003 U.S. Open with a record-tying 72-hole score. Tied for second in the last two U.S. Opens. Won Vardon Trophy (lowest scoring average) in 2006. Member of five Ryder Cup teams and four Presidents Cup teams.

Personal: Learned unconventional looping golf swing from his father. Growing up, he was a catcher, a quarterback and a point guard. Pittsburgh Steelers fan.



[4] Adam Scott

Age: 26. **Turned Pro:** 2000

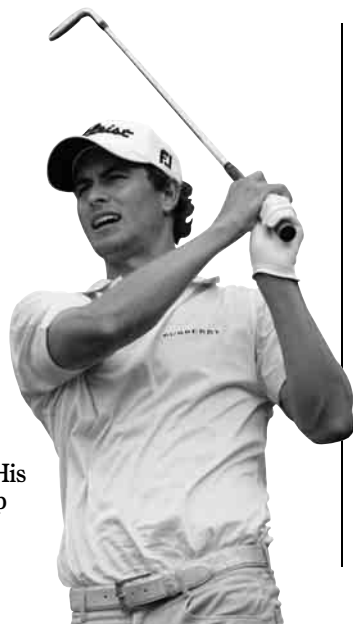
PGA Tour Victories: 5

2007 Earnings: \$2,504,266

Highest World Ranking: 4 (2007)

Notable: Won 2004 Booz Allen Classic at Avenel. Also became the youngest winner of the Players Championship that year. Has seven international victories, including back-to-back wins at Singapore Open (2005, 2006). Member of two Presidents Cup teams. Won Australian junior championship at 15.

Personal: The snappy dresser endorses Burberry. Attended UNLV for two years. His father, Phil, is a golf professional. Grew up in Queensland, Australia, but now lives in Crans-sur-Sierre, Switzerland.



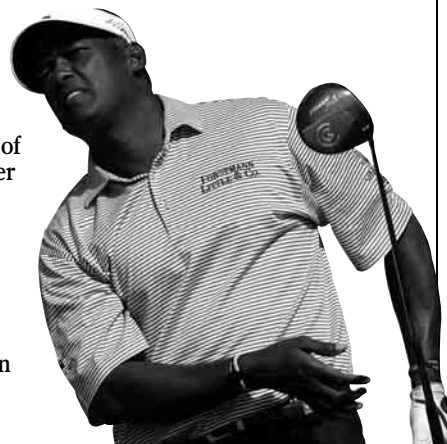
[6] Vijay Singh

Age: 44. **Turned Pro:** 1982. **PGA Tour Victories:** 31

2007 Earnings: \$3,719,393. **Highest World Ranking:** 1 (2005)

Notable: Has 21 international victories. His wins have come in 15 countries. Member of six Presidents Cup teams. Won twice on the PGA Tour this year. Inducted into World Golf Hall of Fame in 2006. Two-time winner of PGA Championship (1998, 2004). Won 2000 Masters.

Personal: Learned golf from his father, an airplane technician. Once worked as a club professional in Borneo. His first name means victory in Hindi.



[8] Geoff Ogilvy

Age: 30. **Turned Pro:** 1998

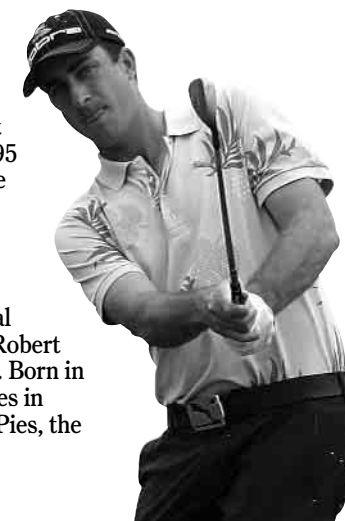
PGA Tour Victories: 3

2007 Earnings: \$1,875,358

Highest World Ranking: 7 (2007)

Notable: Won 2006 U.S. Open, first Australian to win a major since 1995 (Greg Norman) and first to win the Open since '81 (David Graham). Holds the longest active streak of majors without missing the cut.

Personal: A distant relative of Sir Angus Ogilvy, part of Britain's royal family. Another distant relative is Robert the Bruce, former king of Scotland. Born in Adelaide, South Australia. Now lives in Scottsdale, Ariz. Owner of MOJO Pies, the "Original Australian Pie."



[18] Justin Rose

Age: 26. **Turned Pro:** 1998

PGA Tour Victories: 0

2007 Earnings: \$1,233,863

Highest World Ranking: 17 (2007)

Notable: Has five international victories, including 2006 Australian Masters. Led for two rounds at 2004 Masters. As an amateur, tied for fourth in first appearance in a major (1998 British Open). First swung a golf club at 11 months. First hole-in-one at age 10. Broke 70 for the first time at age 11. Turned pro at age 17.

Personal: Born in Johannesburg. Moved to England at age 5. Enjoys tennis, soccer, cricket, cars and movies.



[20] K.J. Choi

Age: 37. **Turned Pro:** 1994

PGA Tour Victories: 5

2007 Earnings: \$2,163,629

Highest World Ranking: 15 (2003)

Notable: Shot a 7-under-par 65 in the final round to win the Memorial this year. Finished third at 2004 Masters. Has six international victories, including 1996 Korean Open. Member of the 2003 Presidents Cup team. First South Korean to earn a PGA Tour card.

Personal: Grew up in Wando, South Korea. Resides in Houston. Learned to play golf from Jack Nicklaus's book "Golf My Way" translated into Korean. A former weightlifter who squatted 350 pounds.



[24] Nick O'Hern

Age: 35. **Turned Pro:** 1994

PGA Tour Victories: 0

2007 Earnings: \$1,208,465

Highest World Ranking: 16 (2007)

Notable: Five international victories, including the 2006 Australian PGA championship. Finished tied for second at 2006 Booz Allen Classic. Member of 2005 Presidents Cup team. Only player to beat Tiger Woods in match play more than once.

Personal: Considered playing baseball or tennis professionally. Father played for the Australian national baseball team.
