## STONEWALL JACKSON

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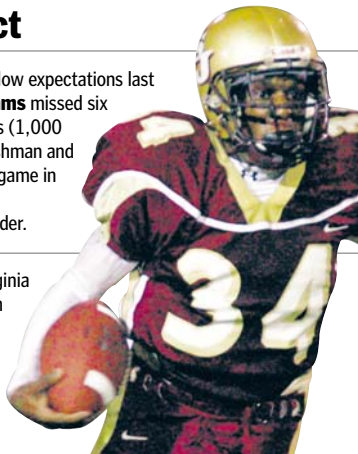
**Coach:**

Starters: 8/6

The Raiders performed below expectations last year after RB **Ryan Williams** missed six games. This year, Williams (1,000 all-purpose yards as a freshman and more than 100 yards per game in four games in '05) makes Stonewall a region contender.



## OSBOURN

2005: 10-2, 5-1

Starters: 6/8

The presence of West Virginia recruit QB Brandon Hogan (2,000 yards passing, 1,100 rushing and 36 TDs in '05) makes Osborn a threat to win the region.

## FAUQUIER

2005: 4-6, 2-3

Starters: 6/3

The Falcons have a shot at contending with play-makers such as DE Nick Caito (12 sacks), G Chris Sutton and RB Walter Davis (more than 800 yards rushing) returning.

## OSBOURN PARK

2005: 8-2, 4-1

Starters: 5/6

The Yellow Jackets will be strong at linebacker, as senior Quille Odom (Va. Tech) returns to an already deep group. A key issue will be replacing departed WR Anthony Bratton.

## BATTLEFIELD

2005: 2-8, 0-5

Starters: 9/9

All-district players Bruce Cinibulk (DE) and Austin Tuell (TE-DE) return but it likely won't be enough for the third-year Bobcats. OL Joe Briethaupt, a 6-4 junior, is a player to watch.

## CULPEPER

Greg Martz

2005: 2-8, 1-4

Starters: 7/3

Curt Orshoski (79 tackles, 7 sacks and 2 INTs) — whom Martz considers the most underrated LB in the state — and Virginia recruit LB Terrence-Fells Danzer will provide stability.
